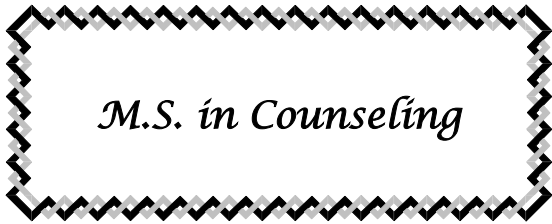

- Application to the Graduate School
- Official Transcripts reflecting a 3.00 GPA minimum on all undergraduate and any previous graduate courses
- Official GRE or MAT Scores indicating capacity for Graduate-level performance
- Application to the Counseling Program
- Three Letters of Professional Recommendation
- Statement of Professional Goals
- Top Applicants will be invited for a Personal Interview with Counselor Education Faculty

Note: Must be accepted by the Graduate School prior to consideration for admission into the Counseling Program.
